Criteria for instructors:

We are looking for people who enjoy working with young people and feel comfortable with instruction. This may be ideal for teachers, retired educators, daycare workers, child education majors, journalism majors, journalists, Sunday School teachers, poets, artists, retired professors, training specialists, writers, bloggers, authors, and editors. If you have a love for language and children and have the time to spare, this might be a good fit. As an instructor, you will be working side by side with young people to help them write stories that will be compiled into a book.

We will have three groups of students: elementary, middle and high school. You will only need to work with your assigned group of students. We are looking for two instructors for each group.

Minimum qualifications

- Must be comfortable working one-on-one with students and leading a small group of up to four students
- Must be comfortable working with another instructor to guide the assigned group of students

- Must have a comfort level with working with students of elementary, middle, or high school age

Desired qualifications

- Enjoys reading and writing and has experience with writing a book or blogging
- Has a background in instruction
- Able to share techniques to help the children write effectively and efficiently

Criteria for volunteers:
